Re: Update for June Board Meeting

Enclosed is a summary of completed and ongoing projects for the facilities department since the last Board Meeting:

## **Elementary School and Middle School**

- Ordered and Received New 760LBS Boiler Section. Between 4 guys we manually brought the section up two flights of stairs and it is now in place. Waiting for Alliance mechanical to provide us with a boiler maker to help reassemble the boiler for inspection.
- Most of the security grant items have been installed. Waiting on a few items to secure the fishbowl and gym.
- Working with Johnson Controls for a permanent solution to our Phone Line issues with our fire alarm system.
- Ran wire and power to Middle School main doors in anticipation of installing a
  new card access as requested by Mr. Tedford as part of the security grant. Alltech
  Solutions realized they quoted us for the wrong materials and the new quote came
  in lower than the last, so we ordered additional parts to secure the elementary
  main doors.
- Rubber roofing company addressed issues at the elementary school and high school.

## **High School**

- Secured the portico with white tarp as the blue shrink wrap was not holding up. Ultimately it is more secure and aesthetically it looks better for graduation
- Fixed plugged drain in Home Economics.
- Set up for voting.
- Rubber roofing company addressed issues at the high school
